Turns pages of a book with 1 to 1 correspondence	Reads and writes numerals 0-10 (out of order)	
Locates the front and back of a book	Classifies objects by color, shape, size	
Tells a story using pictures of a book	Rote counts to 20+	
Locates and points to the title	Sorts, classifies & counts sets (up to 20)	
Knows directionality of text (left to right)	Recognizes basic coins (penny, nickel, dime, quarter)	
Points to the text when asked "Where do I read?"	Understands more than, less than & equal to	
Counts words on a page	Can solve basic addition & subtraction	
Counts the letters in a word	Names & extends basic patterns	
Knows where to start reading	Rote counts to 30+	
Visual Arts Development	Displays 1 to 1 correspondence (less than 10 objects)	
Explore with a variety of media	Identifies 4 basic shapes (circle, square, triangle, rectangle)	
Identify a favorite piece of art	Understands equal vs. unequal sets of objects	
Utilize entire page when using 2-D materials	Extends basic patterns	
Use art as an aid when telling an oral story	Describes & sorts attributes of object (little/big, short, soft)	
Identify art medias; clay, paint, crayons, markers, draw	Recognizes concepts of calendar time
